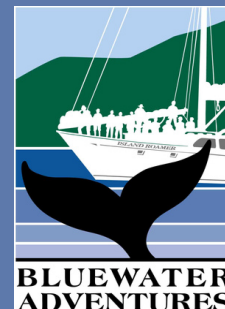

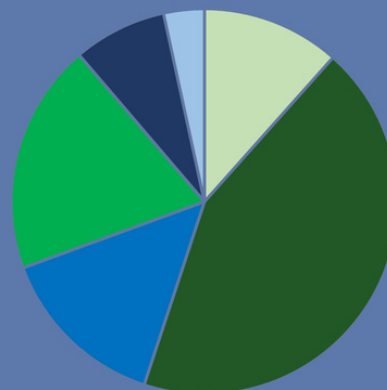

RAINCOAST CONSERVATION

Raincoast Conservation has been working to stop the trophy hunting of grizzly bears and other carnivores since 1996. Since 2005, they have been purchasing hunting tenures as a permanent solution. Bluewater Adventures contributed towards funding Raincoast's purchase of the Southern Great Bear Rainforest tenure. Located on the coast of British Columbia, this tenure covers 18,239 square kilometers – more than a quarter of the Great Bear Rainforest – and contains 6 major coastal inlets, 10 major river systems, and countless other watersheds. Controlling the hunting rights in the area protects not just grizzly bears, but also dozens of species that depend on this ecosystem and would otherwise be subject to commercial trophy hunting.
