The nature of an adventure is traveling into the unknown and thereby learning about the world and oneself. We expect you to arrive prepared to learn, to undertake new activities, challenges, and to try your best. This is an incredible opportunity.

Participant Agreement:

- SV Island Odyssey, SV Island Roamer and SV Island Solitude are beautiful yachts that – abuse of the boats in any way will not be tolerated. Any costs associated with repairs will be the responsibility of the person doing the damage and of their school.
- No junk food - gum, soft drinks, potato chips, candy bars, etc. is permitted on the vessels. Peanuts in any form are not permitted due to serious allergies.
- Consumption of alcohol, combustibles, vapes, cannabis or illegal drugs will not be permitted onboard. Should any prohibited items be found, they will be confiscated. Student/s may be asked to leave vessel.
- Please leave your cell phones and any other electronics at home, or with your Teacher/ Supervisor.
- Make-up, hair dryers, straighteners/ curling irons are unnecessary and can not be accommodated on board. Electricity is not available in the cabins most of the time. Chargers for camera batteries are permitted with a charging station supplied in the salon.
- Water needs to be conserved as we carry a limited amount of fresh water. Availability of showers is very limited - salt water bathing is an alternative.
- Life-jackets must be worn at all times in the small boats, as instructed by your School Board, and otherwise at the discretion of the Crew.
- Clean up after yourself, keep your cabin tidy and carry out your tasks cheerfully.
- There will be set time for lights out which must be respected.
- Only those assigned to cabins are allowed in those cabins.
- Be prepared to listen and follow instructions.

As a Student:

1. I agree to be attentive, ready to help, learn and participate fully in all the operations of the boat,
2. From navigation to sailing, cleaning, dishes, and/or cooking. To be ready to help in any way necessary when asked by crew, a teacher, or an adult supervisor.
3. I have read and understand the "RULES WHILE ON TRIP" and agree that I will follow all of the rules listed above.
4. I understand that anything I bring to the boat that is not permitted will be confiscated and will be disposed of. (such as junk food or cigarettes)
5. If the crew of the vessels at any time feels that my actions or behaviour is disrespectful or has impacted the trip in a negative way, I understand that I may be asked to leave the trip immediately.
