Contract Agreement: SUPERVISORS

The nature of an adventure is traveling into the unknown and thereby learning about the world and oneself. We expect students to come prepared to learn, to undertake new activities, challenges, and to try your best. It is expected that Supervisors will work in tandem with Bluewater crew to create a memorable experience for all students. This is an incredible opportunity.

RULES WHILE ON TRIP - For the comfort and safety of all.

- SV Island Odyssey, SV Island Roamer and SV Island Solitude are beautiful yachts – abuse of the boats in any way will not be tolerated. Any costs associated with repairs will be the responsibility of the person doing the damage and of their school.
- No junk food - gum, soft drinks, potato chips, candy bars, etc. is permitted on the vessels. Peanuts in any form are not permitted due to serious allergies. Snacks will be provided between meals.
- Consumption of alcohol, combustibles, vapes, cannabis or illegal drugs will not be permitted on board. Should any prohibited items be found, they will be confiscated. Student/s may be asked to leave vessel.
- Please leave your cell phones and any other electronics at home, or with your Teacher/ Supervisor.
- Make-up, hair dryers, straighteners/ curling irons are unnecessary and can not be accommodated on board. Electricity is not available in the cabins most of the time. Chargers for camera batteries are permitted with a charging station supplied in the salon.
- Water needs to be conserved as we carry a limited amount of fresh water. Availability to shower is very limited - salt water bathing is an alternative.
- Life-jackets must be worn at all times in the small boats, as instructed by your School Board, and otherwise at the discretion of the Crew.
- Clean up after yourself, keep you cabin tidy and carry out your tasks cheerfully.
- There will be a set time for lights out which must be respected.
- Only those assigned to cabins are allowed in those cabins.
- Be prepared to listen and follow instructions, and communicate with the Captain, any concerns.

As a Supervisor:

1. The Bluewater crew run the vessel and program activities. I am traveling as “Supervisor” and am responsible for maintaining acceptable and safe student behaviour.
2. It is my responsibility to review safety systems with the crew upon arrival and to know how to assist in an emergency.
3. If any student’s actions or behaviour is disrespectful or are negatively affecting the trip, they will be removed from the trip at the expense of the parent/ guardian.
4. I understand that I am considered an additional “crew member” and that I am on board to help.
5. I will supervise the students, during meal preparation and cleaning, as well as participate in activities.
6. Supervisors must model our 'no cell phone' program by limiting their own phone usage to urgent communications conducted away from student view
7. I understand that I am a role model for student behaviour. I will help to promote a positive and respectful learning environment.
8. I have read and understood the "Rules While On Trip" and agree that I will comply fully with all the rules listed.
